## Battle of the Books

Five intrepid West Jeff fifth grade readers headed to Rooney Ranch Elementary School in Lakewood to compete against 24 Jeffco elementary schools on Monday, March 11. They called themselves the Oof Cookies (a combination of the Oof Squad and Cookies ' $n$ ' Cream). Our team included Hermina Lehman, Phoebe Hornfect, Larissa Jensen, Samantha Larcombe, and Logan Johnson. Like the readers from all the teams, they had read and studied 10 books of various genres and prepared extensively for the competition practicing weekly for over three months. The teams competed in several rounds of competition. The first set of questions in round 1 all began with "In which book...". The next set of questions were book specific, so they began, "In the book $\qquad$ , ..."

They survived the first round of questions beating out 12 other schools to go on to round 2 . Round 2 ran similar to round 1 , but unfortunately, the team did not move on to the final round. The competition was fierce and the Oof Cookies did themselves proud. The best part of the whole experience was the level of excitement and expertise displayed by the over 100 students who participated. The joy of reading was palpable and contagious.

Many thanks to Chris Olsen for coaching the kids throughout the three months, to Joan Grawe and Ann Hoy for supporting the kids in the competition, and for all the families for encouraging and supporting their kids as they participated in our first Battle of the Books.

During the month of May, West Jeff Elementary will participate in a One School, One Book ${ }^{\circledR}$ program. The One School, One Book® program (supported by Read to Them®, a ${ }^{\circledR} 01 \mathrm{C}$ (3)), aims to encourage and enable reading together at home by providing schools and families with tools, resources, guidance, and support to read at home.

Every West Jeff family will receive a copy of our One Book to read together at home that they can keep forever. On the Bobcat News on Tuesday and Thursday mornings, students will be asked questions about the book that if answered correctly can win them prizes. We will also have a family reading night (tbd) here at school where kids can come in their pajamas, have some milk and cookies, and enjoy a bit of storytime together.

## Coach's Corner, continued...

We are still in need of some supplies, if you can help with any of the following materials, please drop them off in the office:

Craft Supplies: Googly eyes, Tissue Paper, Feathers (enough for two classrooms)
Seeds (please speak to 2nd grade teachers for specific kind of seeds needed)
Young plants (to study, these need to be pollinator plants. Please speak to 2nd grade teachers for specific kinds needed and how many)
Small egg size / egg looking, stones or other weights
Bird nest materials: sticks, twigs, grass, leaves, strips of yarn and ribbon, pipe cleaners, cotton balls, small pieces of wire
Small containers of playdough (enough for two classes)
File folders (enough for two classes)
Construction paper (shades of green)
Baskets

On our Non-Contact Day, March 15th, grade level teams began working to design and integrate an expedition into one of their EL Modules. Each grade level has come up with a plan that will reach or support others in our community or local areas. These expeditions involve talking with experts, using different environments for learning, being an active investigator and applying research tools and techniques of inquiry. Teachers are currently looking for experts and citizens with first hand knowledge of events or issues to bring into the classroom as part of the learning. Expeditions differ from field trips because students are expected to be active participants in the planning, research and project development. Be looking for information about what expedition your child's grade level will be doing.
